AIM Form Details Window



- Are you tired of not knowing what the note will look when you check a button?
- Would you like to make corrections immediately to the note while entering the information?
- This Pearl will show how the “Detail” window used with an AIM form provides added features to help with Note writing to improve legibility, and accuracy.

The Details window is a powerful tool that is easily overlooked.

- Once the detail box is clicked “on”, it will “hover” at the bottom of the current AIM for window.
- The Detail box shows information on the MEDCIN term that is currently checked and allows you to add additional documentation.

One useful feature is that the details window shows exactly what will be emitted into the note

Just clicking on the term is enough to start

- The entry details box (red rectangle) shows you what the structured note emission will say. You can not change it.
- The second line (Blue box) is a free text area that you can type up to an additional half page to expand on the finding or add clarity/specification.
- The bottom series of features allow the entry of information as explained in the next slide.

Features of the Details Window are shown below. Each can be used independently. This provides each user flexibility in using this feature.
