

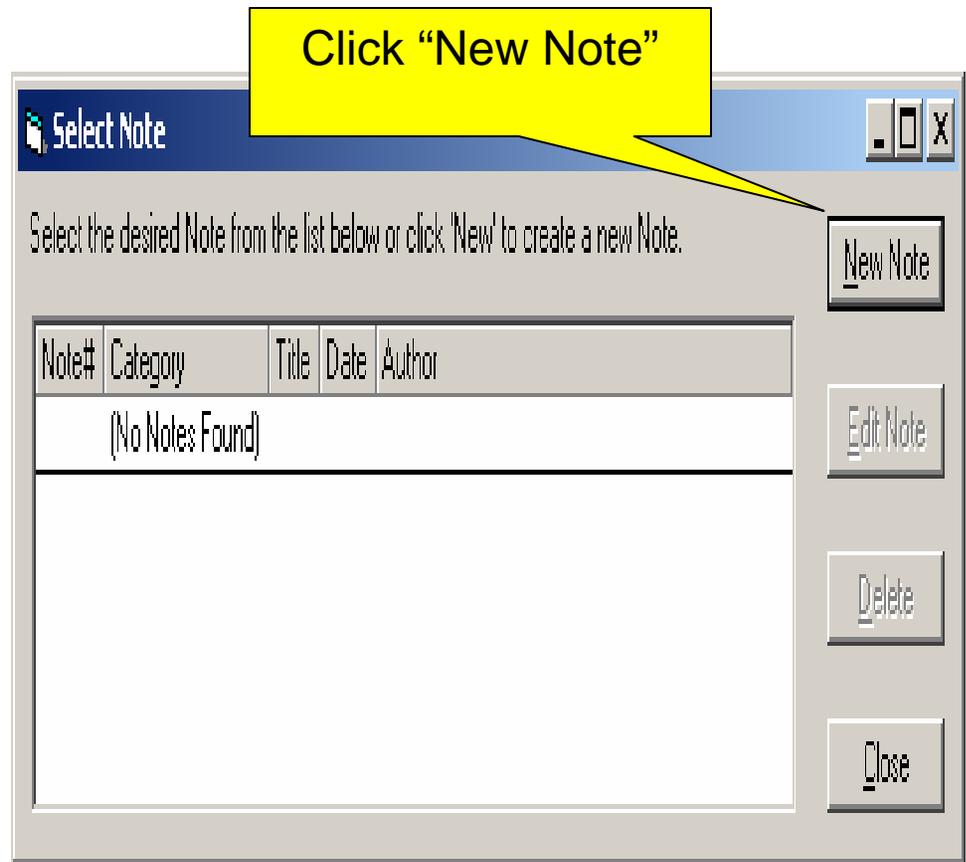
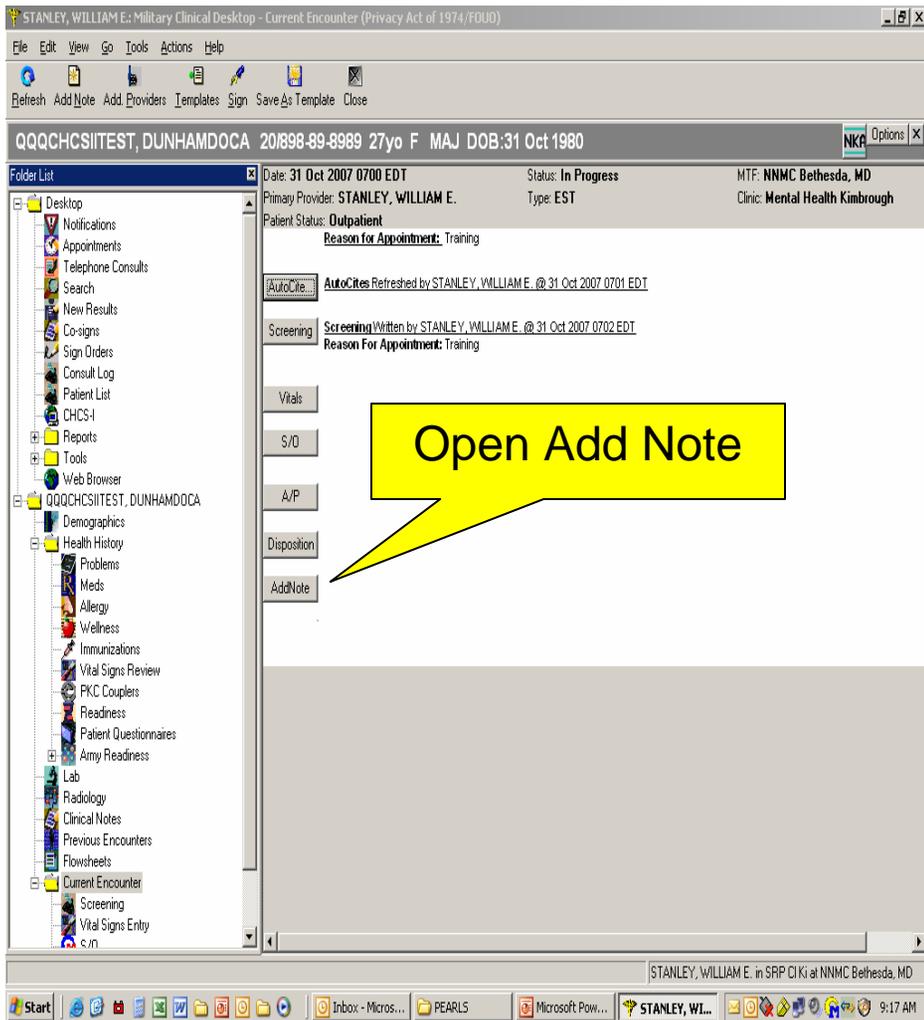

Maximizing your Documentation in AHLTA

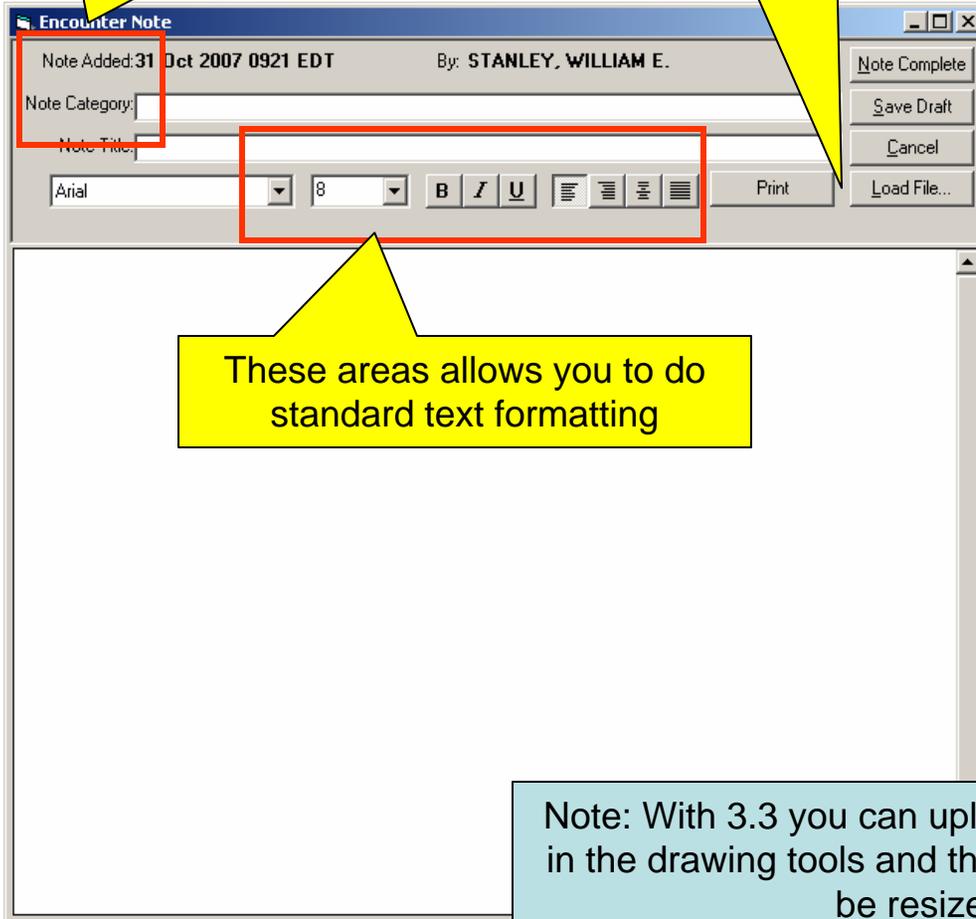
- Looking for a quick and easy way to add documentation to your note?
- Wondering how to meet a specialty specific documentation need?
- By taking advantage of the Add Note you can quickly and easily add text and graphics to your encounter documentation.
- Upload Tables or Canned Documentation using MS Word and Text Documents or paste documentation from other applications into your note.
- Used with PDF Creator, you can capture the printout from any device such as an EKG, EGD note writer, PFT, or any device that can print.
- AddNote is the only area in the encounter note where you can enter more than a page of information. It can be used for new consults and to retain the formatting of information such as Right/Left/Bilateral.



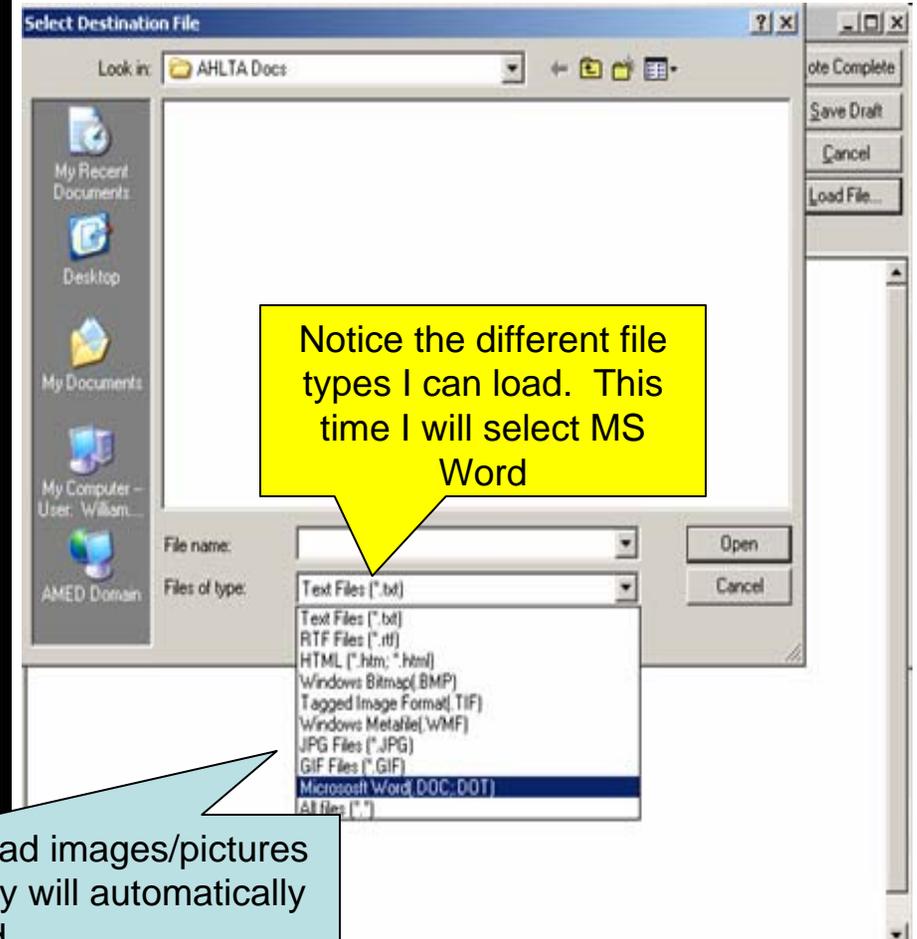
Adding Files to AddNote

These areas are never mandatory.

Click "Load File" and locate the desired file.

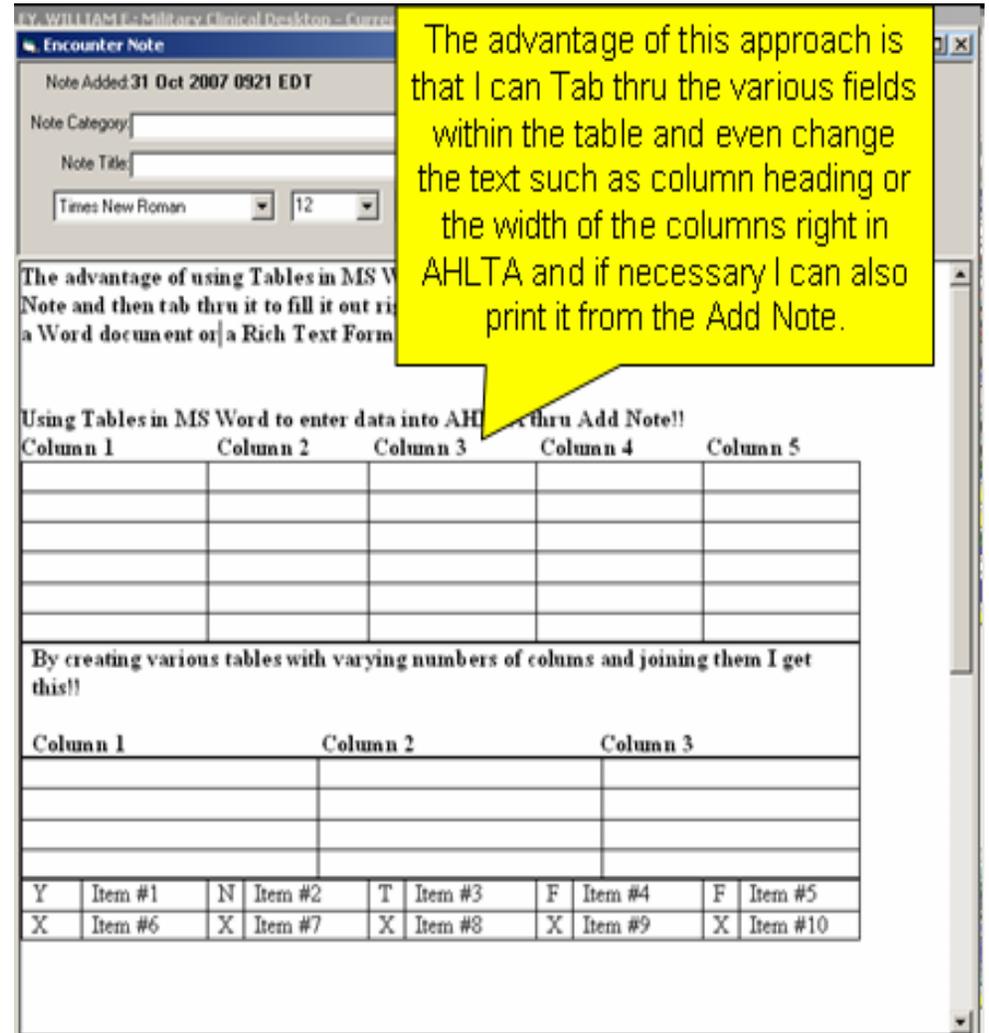
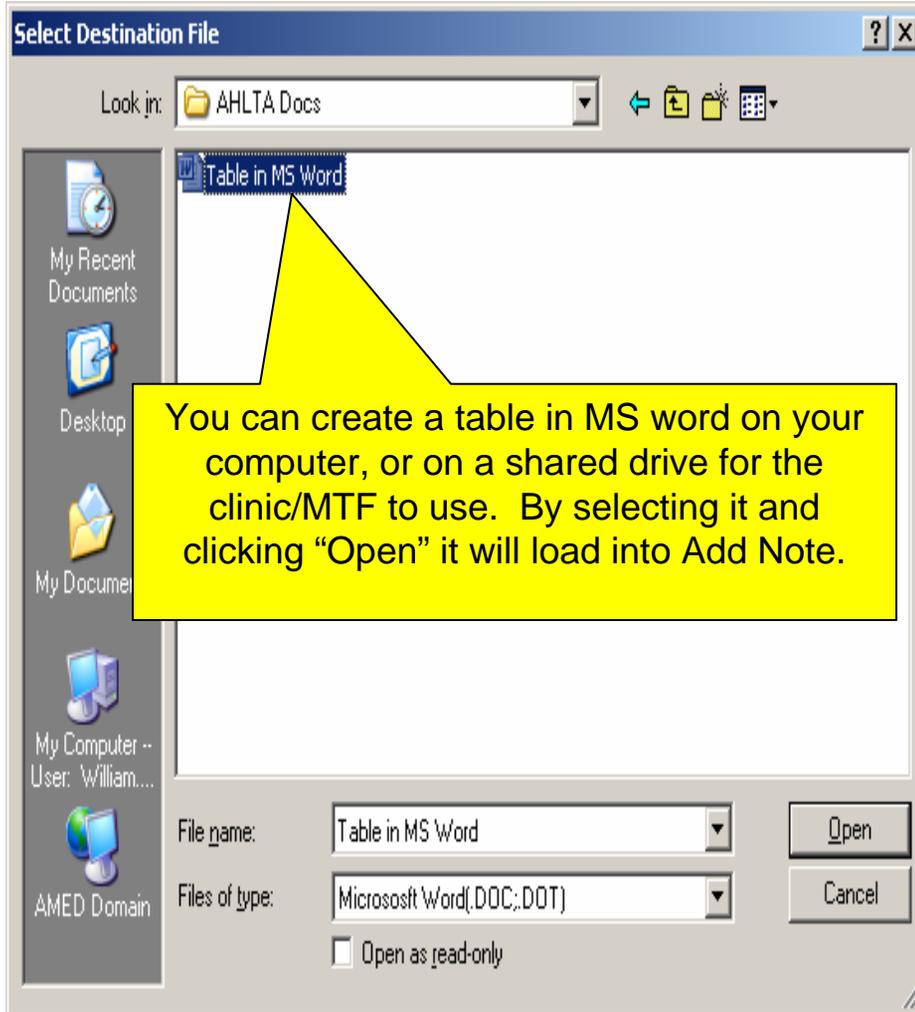


These areas allows you to do standard text formatting

Using a MS Word Table in AddNotes



After saving the AddNote looks like this.

By having Education, Procedure, and other prewritten notes prepared in Word you can quickly document these in an Add Note by either cut/paste or loading the file into AddNote. You can even paste several files back to back.

This is a great tools for those who work mainly from the same PC, who can access a shared drive, or use wireless with a mobile PC.

Although you can copy and paste images and even digital photographs directly into AHLTA, it is best to do this using PDF creator so that the file size is smaller. You can add explanatory text after the image.

Note: In 3.3 it is best to import digital photos using the drawing tool so that the image will resize to fit into AHLTA.

Summary

- The Add Note is extremely flexible, but you must remember that images has a limited size (500k) so use PDF Creator to enter images or with 3.3 use the import capability in the drawing tool.
- Information entered into AddNote is “free text” so is not part of AHLTA coding or patient data
 - Remember to overwrite the coding calculator as appropriate
 - Enter as data using specific MEDCIN terms the items for clinical, administrative, or readiness needs But you do not have to re-write the note in MEDCIN
